We would like to thank Badu House for catering a delicious meal that everyone enjoyed. There is just something about breaking bread together that makes any event special.

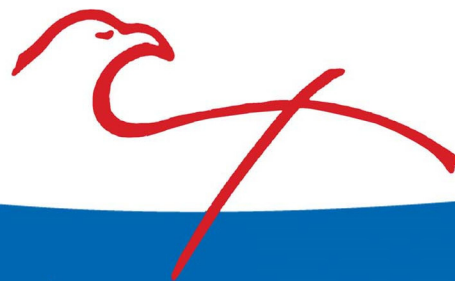
We would like to thank the student waiters and waitresses who worked so hard to add a special flow to the meal - serving tea, water, clearing plates and bringing dessert!

Israel Bound

Llano Christian Academy will be sponsoring a trip to Israel on November 26 - December 8, 2016. This is the senior trip as we will be celebrating our first senior class and graduates. The teaching guides will be Jim and Phyllis Ann Rose. They have taken trips to Israel over 40 times. LCA is blessed to be able to travel and be taught by these servants of Christ.

This trip will provide a glimpse into The Holy Land and will make the Bible come alive through sites and sounds. The trip includes seeing and experiencing the Dead Sea, Jerusalem, Nazareth, the Sea of Galilee, just to mention a few places. Pastor Rose teaches on the trip and provides all participants lessons and opportunities to get up close and personal with the land of our Savior.

The trip will be offered to LCA and citizens of Llano County and surrounding areas for a price of \$4,182 or \$3,038 if you want the land only price. This would mean you would arrange your own air flights. Spaces are limited. The deadlines are sign up by April 1, 2016 and all the money is due on August 1, 2016. The flight will leave out of Austin.
